While we have mostly gone our separate ways, there is no doubt we have similar recollections of the event that forged our bonds. There is nobody out there that better understands what we faced and nobody who can better relate to the internal struggles that some of us still deal with today."

"There are no friends like the friends with whom you have gone to war. They simply become the measure of friendship. And you cannot imagine your life without them. And each time you get to see them, talk with them, and laugh with them you feel that much more whole."

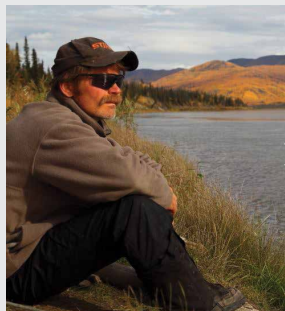

Work Opportunity Tax Credit

A bipartisan group of senators has introduced legislation to make permanent the Work Opportunity Tax Credit, a tax break that encourages companies to hire veterans, people with disabilities and other groups who face barriers to employment, before it expires at the end of 2019.

The WOTC offers an employer tax credit of between \$1,200 and \$9,600 per employee for hiring and retaining employees who are members of populations that traditionally have a hard time finding work, or are often out of the labor force altogether. The credit amount is based on the wages paid to employees within the targeted groups.
